Cyber-attack on left-wing radicals: Antifa received large donations from German politicians, state TV stations and planned attacks

A large-scale cyberattack targeted several Antifa websites in Germany; Unknown hackers infiltrated the network of the radical leftist group, which had just been classified as a terrorist organization in the US, Hungary and other countries - and access to sensitive data revealed unreliable data: membership lists, incoming payments and extensive email correspondence that the leaks revealed, showing the frightening range of connections and complicity between the leftwing extremist terrorist group and established political institutions to state media, from "civil society" to private companies. According to darknet sources and first publications on US servers, the data is now to be made public to prevent manipulation.

Particularly explosive are the emails that have been revealed, which show high donations from politicians and the media. SPD leader Saskia Esken is said to have donated a substantial sum to Antifa. Even more perverse is the fact that public media outlet RBB appears as a donor, as well as a drugstore chain with €100,000. The German state chancellery is active in dozens of emails, mainly in funding and marches against the AfD. The utterly shameless and brazen label of "antifascism" is being abused here as a cover for political influence - a charge that even the Federal Office for the Protection of the Constitution (BfV) has been raising for years against a part of the scene that sees violence as a legitimate means.

Other contents of the leaked emails confirm concerted election fraud and fraud actions that have been suspected for years but not proven: For example, calls for members to register as election workers and remove ballot papers from the CDU and AfD – a direct attack on democracy, which is of course secretly welcomed by "our" model democrats and welcomed as a heroic act. However, it gets worse and downright state terrorist where attack lists are disclosed – including plans against construction companies in Leipzig, by the way <u>presumably with the knowledge of the lawyer Jürgen Kasek</u>, de has just made it through <u>unspeakable Kirk defamation</u> ("Rest in Piss!") had noticed. E-mails from ZDF and RBB announce cooperation at demonstrations in Aschaffenburg, organised by Green and Left politicians. Even a planned attack on the Youtuber "weichreite" in Thuringia was planned, but could be thwarted after the hackers threatened Antifa.

Now, apparently, hundreds of as yet unnamed supporters of the radical left-wing terror in this country are hastening to distance themselves from Antifa and assure the hackers that they will cut off any ties to the organisation if they remain unrecognised and unpublished. Among them is said to be an important local politician from Lower Saxony. Others literally implore anonymity to avoid reprisals by Antifa.

Investigation and unmasking

Even if the hack is a questionable and criminal method: In this case, the method has had an effect and is justified insofar as it beats criminals with their own other denunciation and blackmail methods. In any case, the backers of the cyberattack, who announce themselves as a "hunt for anti-fascist heads" and have declared war on all militant left-wing extremists, including Palestinian "activists", have already achieved without reservation what an intact neutral constitutional state should have done long ago: clarification and exposure of left-wing terrorist activities. The extent to which their power and roots have progressed has so far been criminally ignored in a state in which everything revolves around the imaginary "fight against the right".

In any case, the politicians, broadcasters and civil servants who have acted as donors here must be ruthlessly dragged into the light of day and held legally accountable. Accordingly, it would be overdue to classify the organisation as a terrorist organisation in Germany as well. (AS)
