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## How Big Pharma finances politicians

During the questioning of Robert F. Kennedy Jr. before the Senate about his appointment as US Secretary of Health and Human Services, he was openly subjected to hostile questions. In this context, however, it also became known how much money the hostile politicians were being fed by the pharmaceutical companies.

Pfizer is also helping doctors, associations, politicians and others in Europe who have an influence on vaccination decisions or drug consumption. Associations such as <u>Caritas</u> are fed with sums of up to several tens of thousands of euros. Pfizer has been awarding grants to public

health organizations, civil rights groups, NGOs and doctors' groups for years. Many do not disclose this funding. Journalists are also supported, for example a CNN presenter received 10 million dollars. In Austria alone, according to Pfizer's transparency report, a total of around 23 million euros went to Austrian doctors, associations, medical associations, etc. in 2021.



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He goes on to explain how lies are told:
