Mark Zuckerberg, the CEO of Meta, announced extensive changes to the company's moderation rules on Tuesday. As part of this, Meta, including Facebook and Instagram, will discontinue its previous fact-checking program, which was previously implemented together with external partners. In future, a community-driven solution based on the "Community Notes" from X (formerly Twitter) will be used. He cited the growing importance of freedom of expression and the changes in politics and society as the main motives, reports NBC.

"We will return to our roots and focus on reducing errors, simplifying our policies and restoring freedom of expression on our platforms," Zuckerberg said in a speech. "More specifically, here's what we're going to do. First, we're going to get rid of fact-checkers and replace them with community notes, similar to X, starting in the US." Zuckerberg accused politicians and the mass media of relying more and more on censorship.
