

Shots on golf course: Donald Trump escapes another assassination attempt!

Apparently, Donald Trump narrowly escaped another assassination attempt. The suspected perpetrator has been arrested and the FBI has begun an investigation. Trump himself is combative and stressed that he will not be stopped.

Former US President and Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump apparently narrowly escaped an assassination attempt on Sunday. According to several US media reports, shots were fired at the Trump International Golf Club in West Palm Beach, Florida, while Trump was playing golf there.



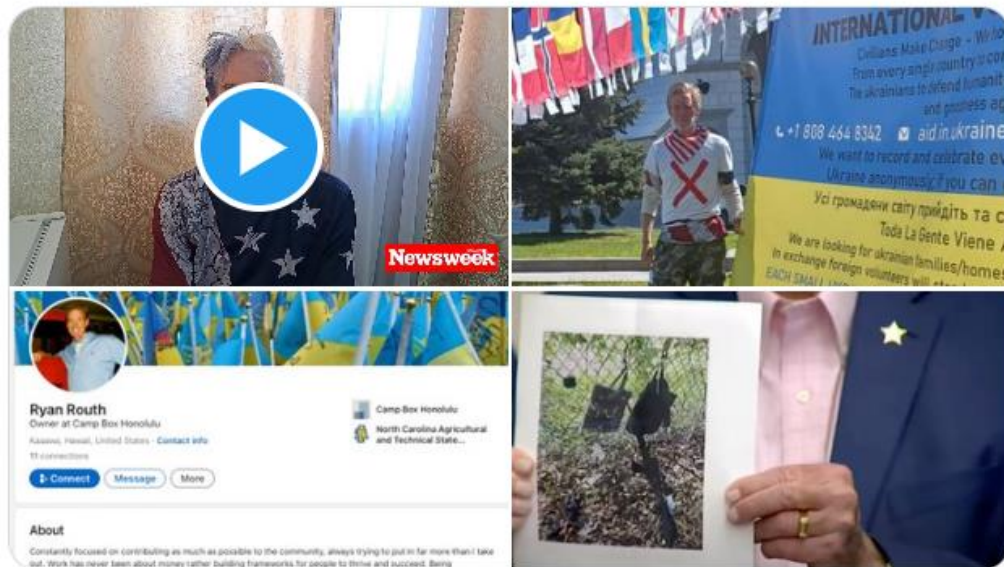

According to the US Secret Service, the incident occurred shortly before 2 p.m. local time. Trump himself was unharmed and, according to his spokesman Steven Cheung, is "safe." The FBI has since begun an investigation and classifies the incident as an "attempted assassination." However, the question arises as to how the gunman knew that Trump would be there, especially since it was not publicly announced that he would be playing golf there.

According to initial findings, an armed man attempted to enter the golf course grounds. Secret Service agents spotted the suspect and opened fire as he attempted to stick a gun through a fence. Trump himself was reportedly about 300 to 500 meters away from the crime scene at the time.

The suspected perpetrator initially managed to escape in an SUV, but was later arrested by local law enforcement in a neighboring district. An AK-47 assault rifle was seized at the crime scene. Investigators also found a backpack and a GoPro camera, suggesting that the perpetrator may have wanted to film his crime.

Fox News identified the suspected shooter as Ryan Routh. Initial examinations of his social media profiles indicate that he is a Trump opponent who holds liberal views and supports Ukraine.

Trump himself reacted to the incident with determination. In a statement, he stressed: "Nothing will stop me, I will never give up." The White House said

that President Biden and Vice President Harris had been informed of the incident and were relieved to hear that Trump was safe.



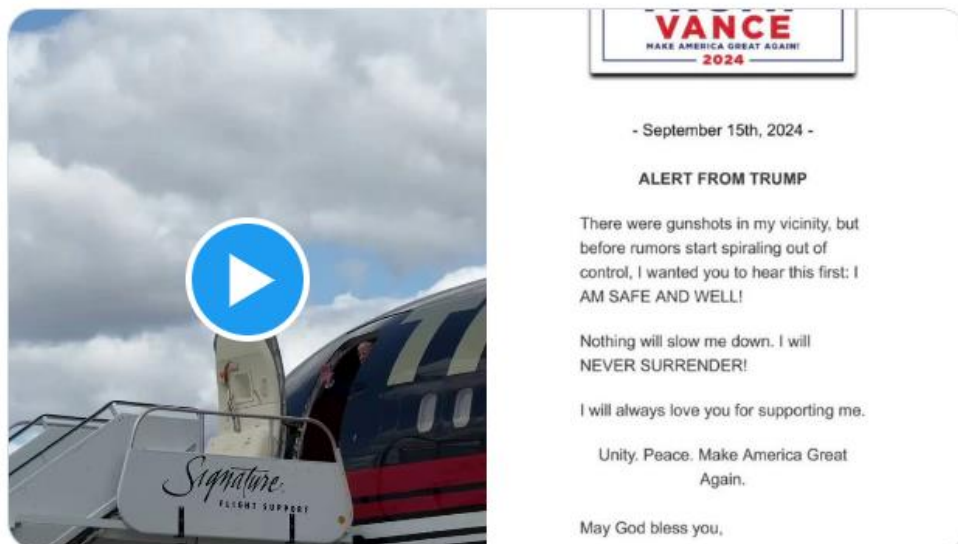

The incident raises further questions about the former president's security. Although Trump was the target of an assassination attempt just a few months ago, as a former president he does not enjoy the full protection of a sitting head of state. Rafael Barros, the Secret Service special agent in charge, stressed at a press conference: "The threat level is high. We live in dangerous times."

Critics see the heated political rhetoric as a possible cause for such incidents. While some media outlets are calling on the Trump campaign to moderate its rhetoric, Trump supporters point out that the other side also contributed to the escalation by repeatedly calling Trump a "Nazi" and a "threat to democracy." The incident underscores the tense political situation in the United States and the security risks for high-ranking political figures.
