



## US leaves IPCC climate panel and dozens of UN organizations

**The US is leaving another global organization in order to stop a "global agenda." Following its withdrawal from the WHO and the Paris Climate Agreement, it will now leave other key UN climate and diversity institutions, as well as the UN International Law Commission.**

Under Donald Trump, the US has already decreed its withdrawal from the WHO, the Paris Climate Agreement, the UN Human Rights Council, and UNESCO. For a year now, the US has been withdrawing massively from the UN and its organizations. Now Washington has taken the next step and is withdrawing from 31 UN organizations and 35 other international organizations.

Above all, the US is continuing to withdraw from climate policy. It is thus saying goodbye to key institutions of the climate agenda such as the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), and the IPCC Climate Science Council.

The decision is based on a review of all US memberships, which Trump had already initiated in February 2025 by executive order and which has now been completed. Other organizations affected include: the UN Population Fund (UNFPA), UN Women, the UN Alliance of Civilizations, the UN Democracy Fund, the UN International Law Commission, and many other organizations. Many of the bodies affected deal with climate protection, the promotion of democracy, and women's rights – issues that the Trump administration considers ideologically charged. The White House argues accordingly: it is not only a matter of avoiding wasting taxpayers' money, but also of stopping "global agendas."

This will further weaken the UN, which will undoubtedly also weaken globalist-liberal plans for world domination. The UN (via the WHO) was a key player in the management of the coronavirus pandemic, and the UN climate agenda, among other things, is a massive attack on the sovereignty of nation states. According to these plans, supranational UN institutions are to take over political world power and introduce a technocratic-digital surveillance dystopia – in other words, Agenda 2030. Weakening the UN also weakens this agenda.

This perspective should not be forgotten in the current debates on international law (which the US has regularly ignored, not only since its intervention in Venezuela) – accordingly, it is not surprising that voices from the EU in particular are currently vehemently defending international law. After all, the EU is the stronghold of the UN agenda.
