## Former Congressman drops bombshell: Two of the 9/11 hijackers were on the CIA payroll

On the PBD podcast, former U.S. Congressman Curt Weldon made a shocking revelation: two of the 9/11 hijackers were on the CIA payroll at the time of the attacks. According to

Weldon, this information came from a high-ranking FBI official who provided him with written confirmation.

"I'll say it again: two of the September 11 terrorists were on the CIA payroll at the time," Weldon said.

Weldon added that between 40 and 50 employees within the US government were reprimanded after the attacks, but there were no consequences or transparency. He called this "scandalous" and asked, "How much longer can people be lied to?"

The revelation once again raises questions about the role of the CIA and the US government in the run-up to and aftermath of the attacks.

According to Weldon, this explosive information came from a high-ranking FBI official who provided him with written confirmation of this fact. The revelation casts a shadow over the US intelligence community and raises questions about how it was possible for terrorists who may have been involved in the attacks to continue receiving salaries from the CIA.

Weldon also reported another scandalous incident: After the attacks, between 40 and 50 employees within the US government were reprimanded, but there were no consequences, no transparency, and no accountability. Weldon called this "scandalous" and said the American people were being treated like "little children" by being denied important information.

"How long will people allow themselves to be lied to?" asked Weldon, calling for a full investigation into the events surrounding September 11. These new revelations raise further questions concerning not only the role of the CIA, but also that of the entire US government in the run-up to and aftermath of the attacks. It remains to be seen whether these statements will lead to further investigations and what impact they will have on public trust in the US intelligence community and its accountability.
